We use Plato Courseware which is a standards-based online learning program grounded in a tradition of solid research, sound pedagogy, and applied innovation. Registration

Attendance Requirements

- Lester High Night School students must attend class nightly, M-F. Students may not have more than 8 absences during the 18 week session
- The building administration will grant an excused absence to a student with a doctor's note, court papers or prior approval by the building administration
- If a student is more than 45 minutes late or leaves early, he/she will be counted absent for that day

Academic Requirements

- A grade of 80% or higher is required on each submission, quiz/or test
- 10 assignments must be completed every week
- Every 6 weeks, 1 course must be completed

"I UNDERSTAND" Statements

Lester Arnold Night Owls has adopted a common set of behavioral/attendance norms which are appropriate for the classroom, campus, and the community. - ----- I understand that Lester Arnold Night School is a School-of-Choice
- ----- I understand that there is a zero tolerance towards fighting and gang activity. The consequence for fighting or gang activity will result in removal of the program.
- ----- I understand that there is a zero tolerance for being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs while on school grounds. Violation of this policy may include but not limited to suspension, leave of absence or removal from the on-line program.
- ----- I understand that there is zero tolerance for selling/possession/or distribution of any drug while on school grounds. This will result in removal of the program.
- ----- I understand attendance is important. I am required to attend Monday-Thursday from 3:30 to 8:00 PM. Excused absences are court, doctor's note or prearranged absence with LANS staff.
- ----- I understand after 8 absences (excused/unexcused) I could be withdrawn.
- ----- I understand LANS is a smoke FREE zone, smoking is not allowed on campus. Breaks will not be given.
- ----- I understand student may NOT change background on computer, download images or documents from the internet, or be on any websites, including but not limited to, games, FaceBook, Youtube, etc... streaming music or videos is not allowed. Listening on your Own device is acceptable.
