Good evening distinguished board and Superintendent Dr. Abergo. My name is Raven-Syamone Wattlely and I have been a first grade teacher at Rose Hill Elementary for the past five years.

Dr. Abergo in the beginning of the year our guest speaker challenged us to find our purpose. I'll tell you my purpose. My purpose is to fight for equal treatment for my students, their parents, and myself. My purpose as an educator is to provide ALL students a rigorous and five star education. My greatest purpose is to inspire every child and adult to be the best person they can be.

Tonight I was asked to stand before you to raise awareness for the lives of minorities in the Adams 14 community. I stand before you as the only African American teacher in Rose Hill. I wear and share my culture with pride and confidence. I also encourage my students, families, and staff to share their culture all year long. Recently, I graduated with my masters in Teaching Applications for specifically minority students. In my research it was found that minority teachers are in the position to stop negative stereotypes and act as role models and mentors for students of color. Since being at Rose Hill I have created a Step Team and a Black Girl Magic club. Both successfully showed that I am a positive role model and inspiration to ALL students.

So if the community can embrace my culture why is it that my district, which serves eighty percent minorities cannot embrace the person that stands before you? In a time where media is embracing who we are and so much acceptance I do not feel that in this district. Every year since 2013 I have had to file some form of discrimination all because my appearance. And every year my reports miraculously come up "MISSING".

When the district initiated Courageous Conversations I felt supported appreciated, and hopeful, that I could support this community. As well as my coworkers, and the community would be supported.

Unfortunately, those conversations have gone silent and I am left once again feeling unvalued. So I ask you all, what is your plan? How do you plan on supporting teachers of color, all teachers, students, and students of color?

I initially was not going to speak tonight in fear of the retaliation. Having a fear like this should not even be a problem, but for many teachers it is. But then I remembered my purpose. I said that my purpose is to inspire others. So by me speaking today I hope that others can for once share their truth.

TOPIC: REQUEST TO PURCHASE FLYER APP TO SUPPORT FAMILY ENGAGEMENT COMMUNICATION EFFORTS DISTRICT-WIDE AND AT ALL ADAMS 14 SCHOOLS

Currently, Adams 14 utilizes various communications platforms which includes: autodialers, webpages, facebook pages, text messaging, quarterly newspaper and flyers. One of the strategic imperatives and priorities of the Board of Education this year is to improve communication and it is also identified in the District's turnaround plan.

Our families and community need better access to district, school and classroom information in a more accessible and consistent way which can be delivered across platforms (mobile, phone, social media, website, email) to improve how the district and schools communicate with families in Adams 14.

Flyer App is the only provider to offer a comprehensive family engagement app and multipurpose communications platform that connects the district, schools, teachers and families together. Flyer App was built with family engagement in mind in order to increase engagement, communication, and resource delivery as a way to build connections and community. Flyer App provides families with an all-in-one tool to access their child's entire school life through their smartphone.

Flyer app is a multipurpose platform that has proven to increase participation and engagement by 25% in district and school activities through its single platform function. Attached, is an overview of the app and its multi-functionality which goes beyond communications and engagement.

The cost is listed below:

The cost for Flyer App for the District and all Adams 14 Schools (including 2 preschools) is \$30,260.00 which will be paid for using District Title I funding. Costs will include annual service fee which covers the following: setup, design, development, alignment with existing communication platforms, launch, unlimited support, training, compliance, app updates, secured hosting and platform access.

Cost breakdown:

- App Setup 13 Schools at \$425
- 9 Preschool/Elementary Annual fee at \$1,785
- 2 Middle School Annual fee at \$2,040
- 2 High School Annual fee at \$2,295

Therefore, it is recommended...

TOPIC: ALLOCATION OF FUNDS TO INCREASE 1.0 TABLE OF AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL FOR A TRANSITION TEACHER FOR THE TRANSITION/SCHOOL TO WORK ALLIANCE PROGRAM

The division of Special Education is asking for an increase of 1.0 TAP to add to the Special Education Transition program serving students who are 18-21 years old for the 18-19 school year. Adams 14 is obligated to special education student who qualify for services when they turn 18 years old until they turn 21. The School to Work Program serves students to age 25. Historically the Transition program served students with significant cognitive needs. The program has become better aligned with the Individuals with a Disability Act and serves students with a variety of needs in special education to support their vocational training. In addition the Special Education department has implemented re-engagement strategies for high school students with a disability who have dropped out. One of these strategies is to provide credit recovery through the transition program, thus increasing the number of students who graduate from Adams 14. This increase in numbers substantiate an additional transition teacher. In addition, the School to Work Alliance Grant will cover the cost of this position.

Therefore, it is recommended...

RECOMMENDATION:

...that the Board of Education of Adams County School District 14 approve an increase of 1.0 TAP for a transition teacher. Salary will be allocated from the School to Work Alliance grant.
