Adams 14 Board of Education

Members of the board, my name is Jorge Garcia, executive director of the Colorado Association for Bilingual Education which conducts business in this district. I want to reaffirm for you that the issues and concerns that I speak of here relate to this district and this community and have been brought to our organization by our members, who live and work here in Adams 14 and by concerned parents of Adams 14 students. I must address statements made to this board by the superintendent in a Feb. 5, 2018 memo that relate specifically to me. In that memo, the superintendent states, and I quote, "Finally, Mr. Jorge Garcia belittled the superintendent and continues to spread information that is not true. Specifically, he stated the superintendent does not support bilingual education and that the district is out of compliance with the Office for Civil Rights Agreement." I acknowledge that I made comments that, no doubt, were embarrassing to the superintendent stating that he is violating Colorado law by failing to register his vehicle and pay those taxes on the vehicle and I stated that his last position prior to becoming superintendent here was that of physical education teacher. I can prove these statements. And am willing to do so if given more than 3 minutes. The superintendent states that I "continue to spread information that is not true". That statement, in writing, is libelous and deserves a response. Please refer to the public statements that I have made including the Jan 9th document entitled Questions and Answers about Adams 14 School District. Quote, "This means that he is not supporting bilingual education in grades 4-12." That is my statement and would be very happy if he made that statement publicly. He hasn't. The district is out of compliance with the Office for Civil Rights agreement. I have stated that and will stand by that statement. If the district fails to implement the plan for biliteracy in grades K-5, the plan provided by the district to the office for civil rights, the district is out of compliance, in my opinion. I heard Director Thomas request a report on the district's civil rights compliance. We have not seen such a report and, if the board has received such a report from the administration I would urge that it be made public. If my claim is proven wrong, I will come before you and publicly apologize to the superintendent and to this board but until then I will stand by my statements and will continue to urge this board to take not just ordinary but extra ordinary efforts to ensure that history is not repeated for the sake of the students and staff of this district.

Quality Teaching for English Language Learners (QTEL) is offering a five-day summer institute for educators July 16-July 20, 2018 in San Francisco, CA. This institute offers educators rich learning opportunities that are designed to expand theoretical and practical knowledge, develop expertise, and promote the kind of quality teaching and student engagement needed to ensure English Learners’ success.

- At least annually, cooperatively determine, with the local school board, the areas and issues, in addition to budget issues, that the DAAC shall study and make recommendations upon.
- Provide input and recommendations to principals concerning the development and use of assessment tools to measure and evaluate student academic growth as it relates to teacher evaluations.
- Publicize opportunities to serve and solicit parents to serve on the DAAC and Building Accountability Advisory Committees (BAAC).

- Assist the district in implementing the district's family engagement policy to increase family engagement.
- Assist school personnel to increase families' engagement with educators, including families' engagement in creating students' READ plans, Individual Career and Academic Plans, and plans to address habitual truancy.

TOPIC: CONTRACT WITH SOLIANT HEALTH FOR THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES OF A FULLY LICENSED SPEECH AND LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST

The Federal Individual with Disabilities Education Act requires that students with disabilities receive special education and related services including speech and language therapy services provided by a licensed speech and language pathologist. The District recently had a staff resignation mid-year. Due to a shortage of speech and language pathologists in the State of Colorado and the demand for these services in our district, we must secure these services for our students immediately. The position has been posted for over a month and we have had no qualified applicants. All efforts to hire and recruit professional staff have failed. There is a need to contract with Soliant Health to provide speech and language therapy services to students in Adams 14. This position will be funded through Student Services general funds.

Therefore, it is recommended....

RECOMMENDATION:

...that the Board of Education of Adams County School District 14 approve a professional contract with Soliant Health to provide federally required special education related services to students with disabilities to meet their related services educational needs for the remainder of the 2018-2019 school year, not to exceed \$40,000 funded through Student Services general funds.
