Superintendent’s Report

Homecoming Awards—Representatives from the Commerce City Business and Professional Association presented the 2017 Homecoming Parade trophies to the parade participants.

Conclave Conference Presentation—Adams City High School Business Teacher Karen Sheff presented information regarding her recent participation at the Conclave Conference. The training consisted of four days of intensive learning and sharing best practices with peers from Colorado and other high schools around the country. Intertwined into each day’s agenda were interactive activities and guest speakers from the business world including local entrepreneurs and executives. Networking with the business professionals throughout the week helped keep my business skills relevant to pass on to students. Ms. Sheff also brought students to share how they are directly impacted in class.

Beyond Textbooks Visit Presentation—Chief Academic and Innovation Officer Aracelia Burgos shared the teams experience on their visit to Vail School District to observe Beyond Textbooks (BT). The Adams 14 team met with district leaders from Vail at their district office and discussed technology department flowchart; technology used in schools; tech PD. On the Wednesday, November 8 they visited Empire High School, Esmond Station K-8, and discussed observations; high school schedule; technology discussion; school expectations; tour classrooms; held roundtable lunch discussion with teachers. Lastly, on Thursday, November 9 they visited Andrada High School and alternative school

where they were able to gain understanding of their robust Career & Technical Education program. **Education of Homeless Children and Youth Conference Presentation**—Adams 14 Title X Liaison Mary Ann Mosquera shared her experience at the Education of Homeless Children and Youth Conference she attended. Ms. Mosquera has gained the following: better able to communicate the barriers to identifying homeless children at the school level; recognize the effects of doubling up are hard to understand-especially for local district staff; increased understanding of many facets of homelessness, especially what decisions they have to make every day; empathy, understanding, openness, non-judgmental, etc.; how to help school staff and communities to recognize the broad definition of homelessness and its impact on our students and their learning, learned that experiential learning is about creating activities based on real-life situations that engage learners/ participants in problem-solving with no predetermined right answers; and learned how to provide training to school staff and communities.

TOPIC: APPROVAL TO CONTRACT WITH ADAMS COUNTY HEAD START TO PROVIDE PRESCHOOL PROGRAMMING FOR STUDENTS IN ADAMS 14

Adams County District 14 receives funding to provide free or low cost preschool programming through the Colorado Preschool Program. This funding pays for the tuition cost to attend half or full day programming. In order to maximize the number of students Adams County School District 14 service, most of the programming is half day with a handful of full day programming. Due to limits on space and personnel, Adams County School District cannot serve all families who desire preschool programming. The overflow of students can be served in licensed preschool facilities within the Adams 14 school district boundaries. One of these facilities is the Adams County Head Start that provides high quality programming. If we are not able to use all of the Colorado Preschool Program allocations, then we must return the funds to the State and potentially lose this funding that could impact preschool expansion in the future. Funds are provided from the General Fund – Colorado Preschool Program funding.

Therefore, it is recommended...

RECOMMENDATION:

...that the Board of Education of Adams County School District 14 approve the contract with Adams County Head Start for the 2017-18 school year, not to exceed \$18,000, budgeted from General Fund - Colorado Preschool Program funds.

A school counselor at Adams City Middle School is seeking approval for in-state overnight travel to attend the Where Everybody Belongs Basic Training in Colorado Springs, CO, January 28-31, 2018.

Sponsored by Where Everybody Belongs, this three day conference will focus on training to develop and implement a mentorship program with eighth grade students mentoring sixth grade students during the transition from elementary school to middle school. In other Title I schools, implementing this program has shown reductions in absences, fewer discipline referrals, and higher grades while helping sixth grade students feel more prepared to enter middle school and also more supported throughout their first year.

The registration fee of \$2,595.00 includes three days of training, three nights of lodging, and all meals. An additional \$81.00 will be allotted for mileage to and from Colorado Springs. The total amount of \$2,676.00 will be paid from Adams City Middle School's General Fund Budget.
