**TOPIC: APPROVAL TO APPLY FOR FUNDING FROM THE COLORADO
DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FROM THE RETAINING TEACHERS
GRANT PROGRAM**

The department of Federal Programs requests approval to apply for the Retaining Teachers Grant Program in the amount of \$125,000 for the 2019-2020 and the 2020-2021 school years from the Colorado Department of Education. The grant provides school districts with the opportunity to implement strategies to improve their ability to successfully retain teachers. The funds from the grant will be used to create a robust teacher induction program for new teachers, peer review and mentorship programs and other career development and advancement strategies, and programs to provide professional development for the creation and implementation of career advancement pathways for master teachers and teacher leadership positions for effective teachers.

Therefore, it is recommended...

RECOMMENDATION:

...that the Board of Education approve the request to apply for the Retaining Teachers Grant Program from the Colorado Department of Education for the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years in the amount of \$125,000.

TOPIC: APPROVAL TO ACCEPT PROCUREMENT OF THREE NEW SCHOOL BUSES

Transportation Services on behalf of Adams County School District 14, requests approval to expend \$70,000.00 in funding per year for the next five years for new school bus procurement from 2019-2020 Capital Reserve funds allocated towards "yellow fleet".

The expenditure is intended to support replacing three old school buses that are beyond the 15-year-old threshold. By replacing these older buses, we greatly reduce pollution and provide considerable safety improvements. New school buses are also a cost effective strategy to reduce maintenance costs.

Competitive procurement is being utilized as per the National Joint Powers Alliance (NJPA) Contract # 102115-BBB with the manufacturer Blue Bird and local dealership Colorado/West Equipment, Inc. NJPA is a Service Cooperative and provides nationally leveraged and competitively solicited purchasing contracts in cooperation with Uniform Contracting Law.

Therefore, it is recommended...

RECOMMENDATION:

...that the Board of Education of Adams 14 accepts entering into a contract with Colorado/West Equipment, Inc. for \$70,000.00 for replacing three school buses which will be accounted for in the 2019-2020 Capital Reserve fund.

TOPIC: APPROVAL TO AMEND THE AMOUNT SPENT ON RENAISSANCE LICENSES

As the District values progress monitoring in both student growth and achievement, Renaissance Star Reading and Math assessments provide greater instructional information for teachers on where individual students are in their learning progression towards standards mastery. Renaissance provides reports and data dashboards that track students' path to mastery from the beginning to the end of the school year, and from year to year.

On June 25, 2019, the Board of Education approved \$59,000 to purchase licenses from Renaissance Learning for all schools. The Department of Curriculum & Instruction is requesting to purchase (7) additional licenses in the amount of \$2,837.25 to be paid from the student assessment general fund account.

Therefore, it is recommended....

RECOMMENDATION:

...that the Board of Education of Adams County School District 14 amend the amount spent from \$59,000 to \$61,837.25 to purchase additional licenses from Renaissance Star assessments to be paid from the student assessment general fund budget.

TOPIC: APPROVAL TO AMEND THE AMOUNT SPENT TO PURCHASE FOOD FOR AUGUST 5-6, 2019 TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Department of Curriculum and Instruction is requesting to amend the amount spent on districtwide professional development on August 5 & 6, 2019 from \$6,400 to \$7,565.42.

During the June 11, 2019 regular board meeting, the Board of Education approved \$6,400 to purchase lunch for teacher's professional development. The department estimated the cost based on 400 teachers attending both days of training.

On August 5 & 6, 2019, the department provided training to 460 teachers and cost \$1,165.42 more than the \$6,400 previously approved by the Board of Education. The total cost for lunch was \$7,565.42 to be paid from the curriculum and instruction general fund.

Therefore, it is recommended...

RECOMMENDATION:

...that the Board of Education of Adams County School District 14 amend the amount approved to purchase food for teacher professional development from \$6,400 to \$7,565.42 to be paid from the curriculum and instruction general fund.

TOPIC: APPROVAL TO PURCHASE READING WONDERS FROM MCGRAW HILL

The Department of Learning Services is requesting to purchase Reading Wonders from McGraw Hill. Wonders is a researched based program that provides a comprehensive set of resources for all students for grades 3-5, and aligns with K-2 Superkids, which the department purchased last school year. This purchase will also include Lectura Maravilla for Kindergarten and 1st grade English language learner students. In alignment with policy DJ, the department conducted a curriculum process for this request.

The cost of the program and professional development is as follows:

- \$125,307.27 to be paid from READ Act funds
- \$461,077.04 to be paid from Instructional General Funds

For a total of \$586,384.31 not to exceed \$590,000.

On Friday August 9, the department Instruction conducted a curriculum selection process for grades 3-5 literacy curriculum. The purpose of the curriculum review was to select a resource that provides consistency and alignment throughout all elementary schools. Pati Montgomery, representing MGT, and Dr. Patterson facilitated the process. Participants viewed the following curriculum: Wonders – McGraw Hill Into Reading – Harcourt Mifflin-Ready Gen - Pearson CKLA – Amplify. The process was open to teachers who work with students in grades 3-5, a principal, special education teachers, Biliteracy teachers, a district administrator and parents.

The participants formed four groups and reviewed the curriculum for approximately 30 minutes per curriculum kit. The staff used a Core Instructional Review Checklist in this process, which provided guidance on how to review the curriculum kits, and gave them the opportunity to discuss how to use the curriculum in their classrooms.

After reviewing the curriculum and moving through an extensive selection process, the committee decided to recommend Wonders by McGraw Hill for grades 3-5. The committee also recommended Maravillas, the Spanish version of Wonders for grades K-1. Kemp, DuPont, Hanson and Central will pilot Maravillas in K-1 bilingual classrooms.

The Wonders reading curriculum for several reasons.

1. It aligns with the district's current K-2 curriculum, Super Kids.
2. It is on the Colorado Department of Education's recommended list of Comprehensive Core Reading Programs.
3. Its instructional routine is explicit and systematic.
4. It aligns with the Colorado READ ACT.
5. The curriculum review committee selected Wonders as its top choice.

The curriculum options will be advertised for public review from Friday, August 9-16, 2019 on the district Facebook Page and Flyer App.

Therefore, it is recommended...

RECOMMENDATION:

...that the Board of Education of Adams County School District 14 approve the purchase of Reading Wonders, Lectura Maravilla and professional development in the amount of \$586,384.31 with \$125,307.27 to be paid from READ Act funds and \$461,077.04 to be paid from Instructional General Funds. The total amount will not exceed \$590,000.
